

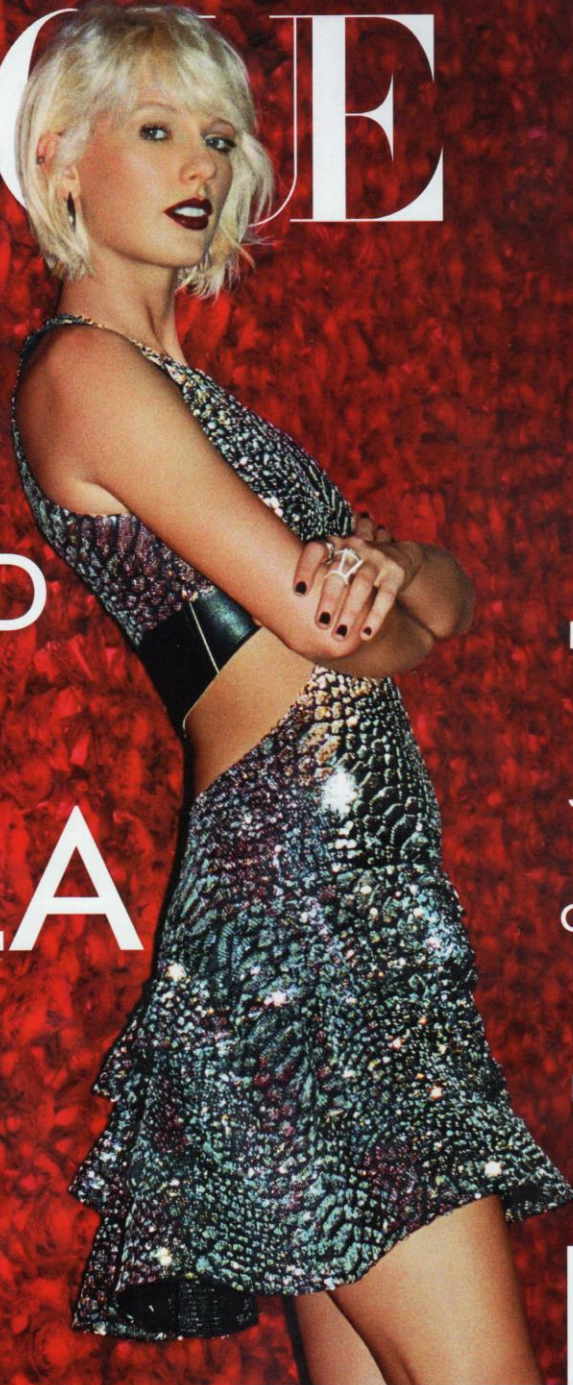

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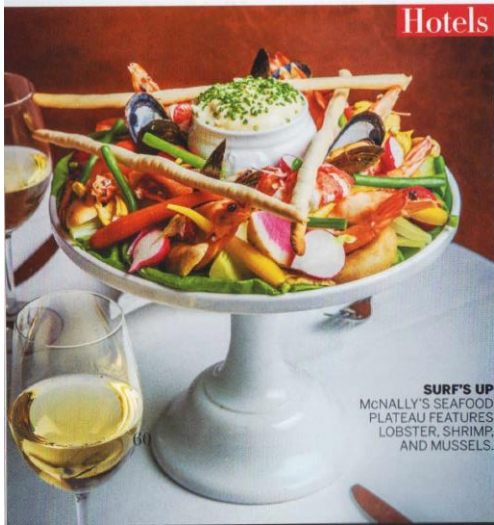

# STAY Awhile

When visiting New York, the question is often whether to go classic or cool. Luckily, the city's buzziest openings include one of each. Long the only game in Brooklyn, the Wythe gains some hip competition in the **Williamsburg Hotel**, opening just down the street. Its airy rooms are outfitted with oak-herringbone floors and tufted-leather headboards, while chef Adam Leonti sources whole grains for a carb-indulgent restaurant

on the first floor. Then there's the subterranean ballroom, which, with its 30-foot ceilings and magnificent chandeliers, is perfectly suited for a colossal cool-kid wedding.

Should you prefer to rest your weary, danced-out feet in more formally grand surroundings, head across the river to the **Beekman**, in Lower Manhattan. The lofty, landmarked Victorian structure features banisters of scrolled ironwork that lead up to an original glass atrium, while twin redbrick turrets house a pair of penthouse suites. Thanks to designer Martin Brudnizki, the all-new interiors of gem-toned sofas and steel-topped bar carts are vintage in feel. And the food? Restaurants from Keith McNally and Tom Colicchio are about as Manhattan as you can get.—LILI GÖKSENIN

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
